MARS PETCARE BATHURST PUBLIC POLLUTION INCIDENT RESPONSE MANAGEMENT PLAN (PIRMP)

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1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this document is to provide, to the public, the relevant information required by the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 and Protection of the Environment Operations (General) Regulation 2009.

2. MARS Petcare Bathurst Site Activities

The Mars Petcare Bathurst site is a dry petfood manufacturing facility, which uses a combination of raw materials and production processes to produce dry dog and cat food. These activities are conducted in accordance with the relevant Environmental legislation, as well as the site's Environmental Protection Authority License.

Notification Speed of Response

The requirement for notification of a pollution incident is 'immediately'. 'Immediately' means 'promptly without delay', but it does not mean undertaking notification ahead of doing what is necessary to make safe.

Communicating with neighbours and the local community

The method of communication with adjacent facilities and residents will depend on the risks posed by the incident as follows:

Nature of pollution incident	Mechanism for warning residents
Risk to health and safety of nearby residents appreciable	Door knocking, telephone and/or letterbox drops
Risk to health and safety of nearby residents not appreciable	Media release and Council website (where applicable)
